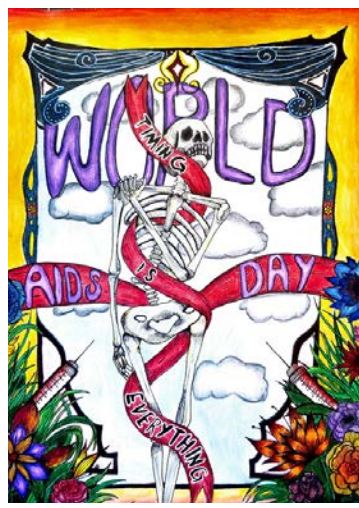

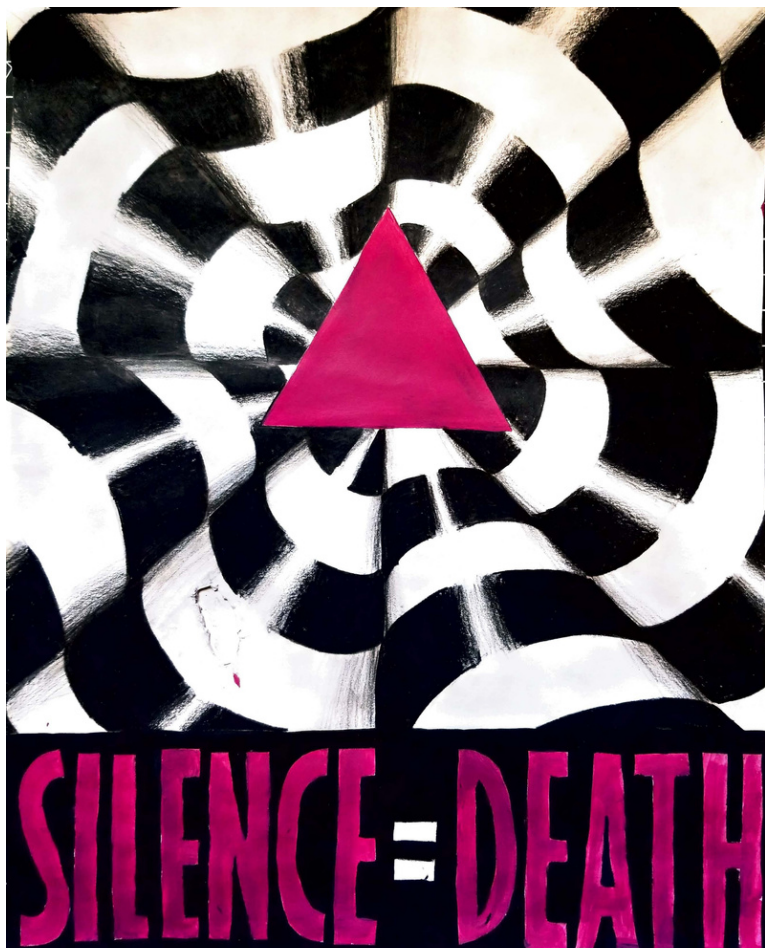

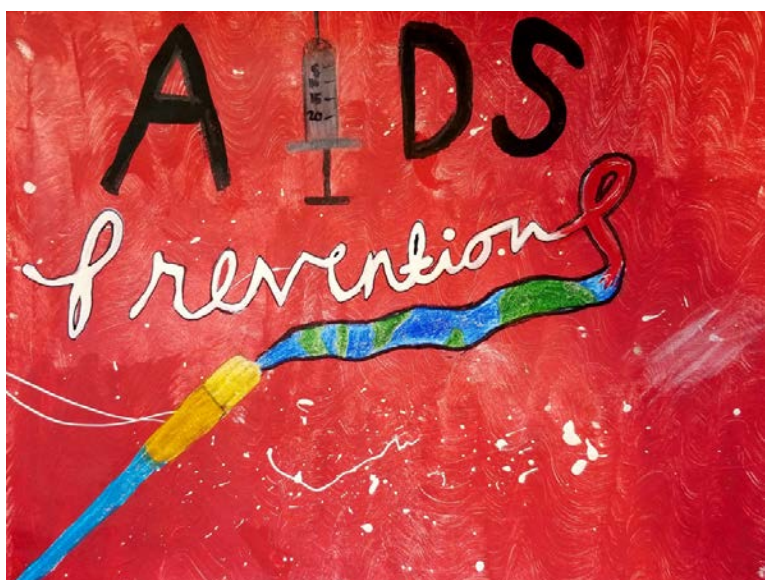
OUR MISSION

Middle school students from HISD have participated since 2015. CCM's "Art on the Streets" contest enlists HISD middle school students to submit artwork based on a particular theme. Currently the theme is "World AIDS Day". In 2020, 723 kids submitted artwork and the contest had a grand prize of \$1000 with additional prizes of a summer scholarship from the Glassel School of Art a teaching institute of the MFAH - Museum of Fine Arts Houston. 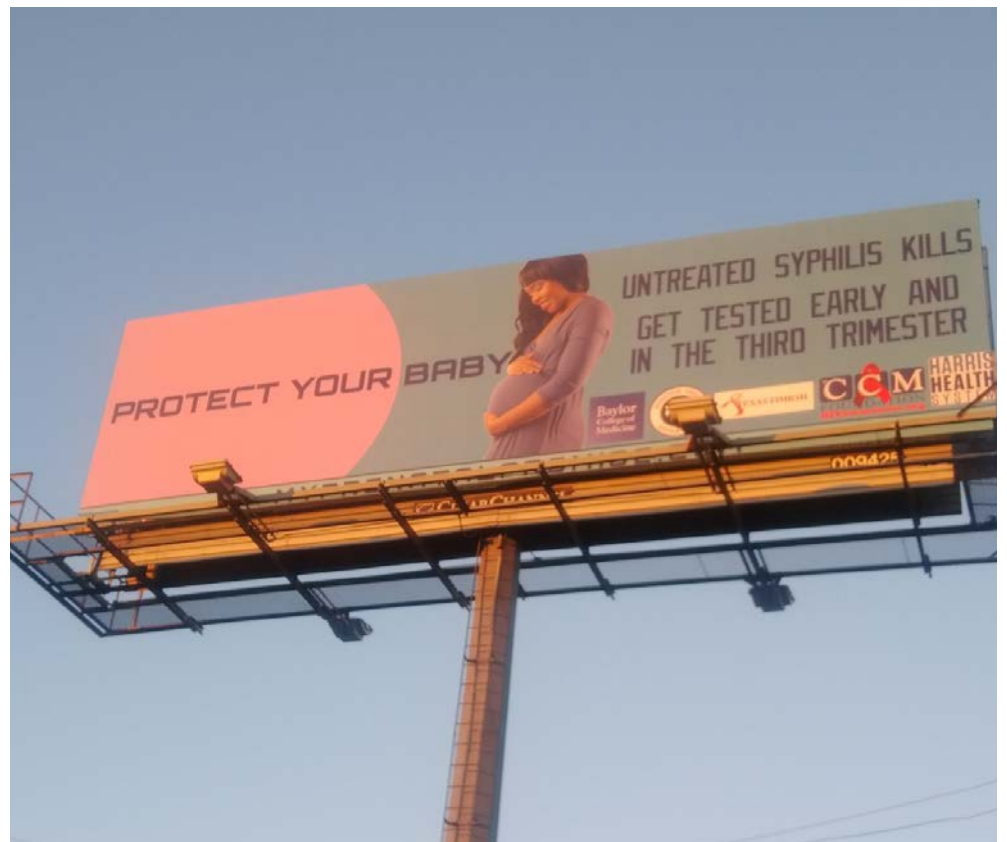
Art On The Streets 2021 Calendar

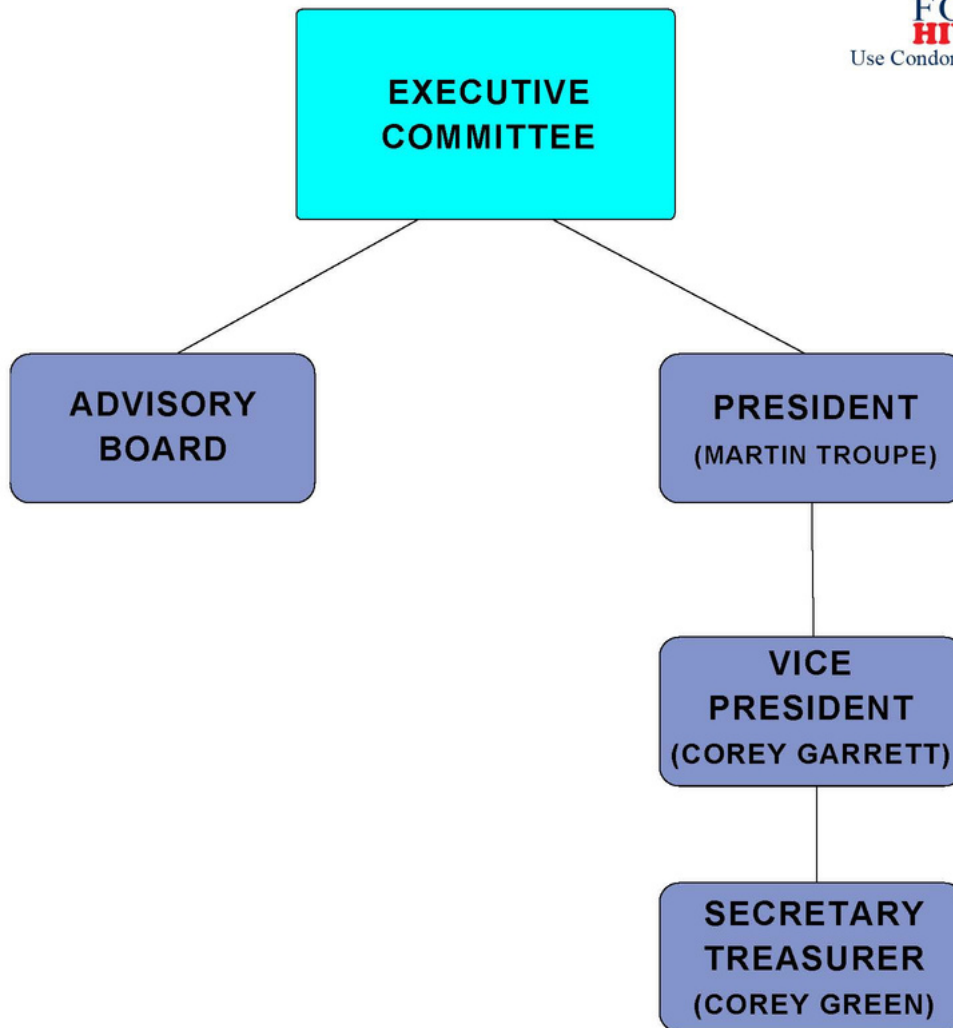
